# The Ready to Inspire Success and Excellence (RISE) program





Adjusting to college life and earning a degree are hard enough for any student. To optimize the Marquette experience for multicultural and first-generation students who may otherwise struggle to feel at home on campus, the Division of Student Affairs created the **Ready to Inspire Success and Excellence** program.

**RISE** provides curricular and co-curricular offerings that begin the summer before freshman year and run through graduation, helping students from underrepresented backgrounds make the most of the Marquette experience to reach their full potential.

RISE embodies Marquette's Catholic charism and Jesuit differentiation — meeting individuals where they're at in their personal and professional journeys to ensure equality among all God's children, each of us called to serve the greater good.

#### **Outcomes. Needs. Opportunities.**

Today's RISE:

- Collaborates across campus from Career Services to the Office of Diversity and Inclusion. Be it focus
  groups on pursuing internships, lunches with the provost to explore the potential of graduate school or
  fun, cohort-bonding socials such as Marquette basketball games, RISE offers engaging opportunities for
  program participants to make the most of the Marquette experience.
- Continues to attract participants since its launch in 2018:
  - A new cohort of 40 freshmen representing the Class of 2027.
  - o A community of approximately 265 participants, including freshmen, sophomores, and juniors.
  - Fifteen peer mentors RISE "veterans" paying it forward by helping incoming program participants transition to college and feel part of a vibrant, caring community.
- Serves as a model, earning the 2019 Ignatian Medal for Outstanding Commitment to Diversity and Social Justice awarded through the Jesuit Association of Student Personnel Administrators.

#### **Mission critical**

- Approximately 33 percent and 23 percent of freshmen who began in the fall 2023 semester are persons of color and first-generation students, respectively.

  - Ultimately to serve 320 students across the freshman through senior classes.
